Dr. Roger Baud founded YES in 2000 as executive director of the "Alliance of Global Sustainability" and ETHsustainability. He operated YES for 14 years – of which during 5 years as director of the ETH Spin Off ACTIS Education. Dr. Roger Baud is currently YES faculty member.

Dr. Roger Baud has a PhD. in Social Psychology and Journalism from the University of Zürich (1973). He began his career as a high school teacher and psychology assistant at University of Zurich, where he conducted social research in the public sector. Dr. Baud has also been the director of various tourism enterprises and an environmental NGO and has acted as an environmental tourism consultant leading research projects with the Swiss National Science Foundation.

Michelle Grant is currently the Executive Director of the World Food System Center at the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology (ETH) in Zurich.

She holds a Bachelor and Honors in Chemical and Environmental Engineering from the University of Queensland in Australia, along with Master in Management, Technology and Economics from the ETH Zurich.

After working for several years as an Engineer in Australia, Norway and Costa Rica, she first joined the ETH in 2004 as the lead Project Manager at the former ETHsustainability. In this role she was responsible for the education, research and outreach programs of the Center, including running and expanding the YES program in six different world regions. More recently she ran her own consultancy business in Australia, which included a large project to establish the International Energy Center, a joint research and education initiative of 3 leading universities and a large industry partner.

Since 1996, Klaus also works as a visual process manager and consultant. He has developed the Universal process guide, the Colour cycle analysis and the Sustainable Business Navigator. Klaus is author of several books about creativity, business and change management, including "Metaphoric Management" (Springer-Verlag, 2011).

Klaus teaches art and creativity in the YES courses, and has also worked in collaboration with ETH Zürich, MIT Boston and the University of Tokyo in global sustainable education program. He has also been involved with an MBA program at the University of St. Gallen.

Born and educated in India, Prabhu is Distinguished Professor of Global Business, Management and Public Policy, William Carey University, India, and Member of the Board of the Institute of Management, University of St Gallen, Switzerland. For over 15 years, Prabhu was Executive Director of Organisation Development at Wolfsberg, a subsidiary of UBS, responsible for think tanks, briefings, and Wolfsberg's Distinguished Speaker Series.

His contribution in the YES program is based on a detailed knowledge of the global financial system, combined with moral and ethical perspectives. The outcome is often a debate around fundamental questions: What is money? How does the financial system really work? Should we allow usury? What is the impact on sustainability?
